The United States of America, To all to whom
Homestead Certificate no 1064. these presents shall
Application 2777. Come, Greeting:
Whereas there has been
deposited in the General Land Office of the United
States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office
at Montgomery, Alabama, whereby it appears that
pursuant to the act of Congress approved 20th
May 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on
the public domain," and the acts supplemental
thereto, the claim of Redmon Burn has been
established and duly consummated, in conformity
to law, for the north half of the northeast quarter
of Section twenty-four, in Township twenty
one south of Range five west, in the district
of lands subject to sale at Montgomery, Alabama,
containing seventy-nine acres and ninety-six hundred
ths of an acre, according to the official Plan of the
Survey of the said Land, returned to the general
Land Office by the Surveyor General:

I have known ye. that there is, therefore, granted
by the United States unto the said Redmon
Burn the tract of land above described:

To have and to hold the said tract of land, with
the appurtenances therof, unto the said
Redmon Burn and to his heirs and assigns
forever. In testimony whereof I, Rutherford
B. Hayes President of the United State of America
have caused these letters to be made Patent,
and the seal of the General Land Office to be
hereunto affixed. Given under my hand
at the City of Washington, the twentieth day
of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and eighty, and of the Independence
of the United States the one hundred and fourth
