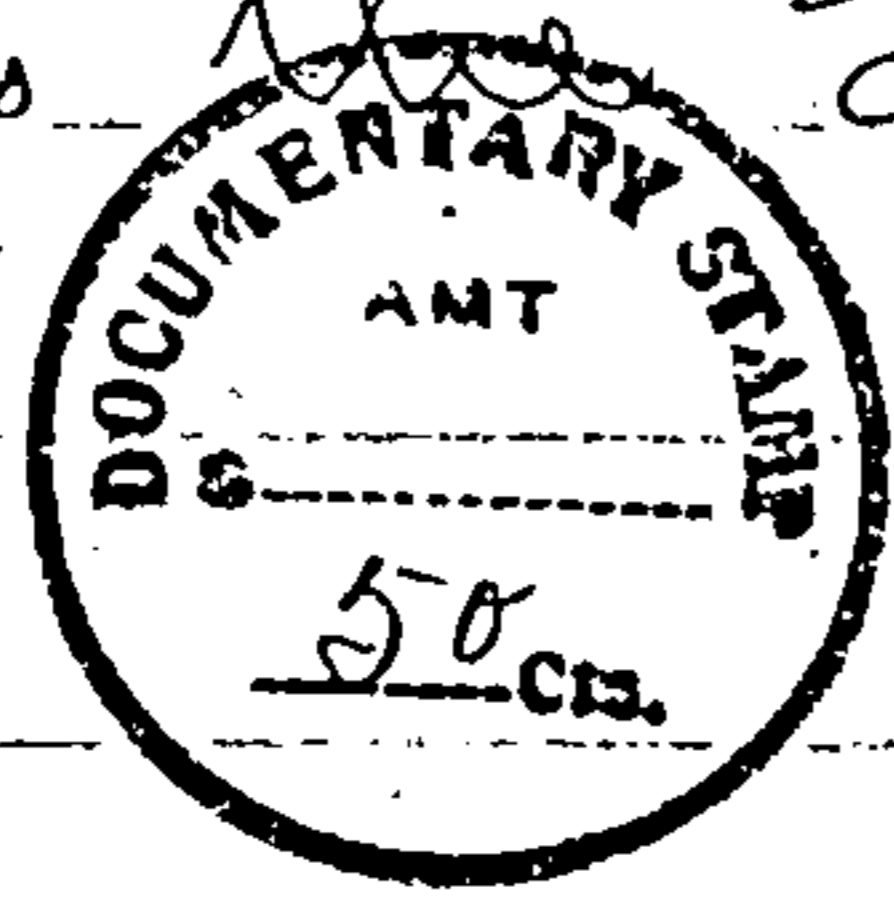

following described real estate, to-wit: Lot number Three (3)

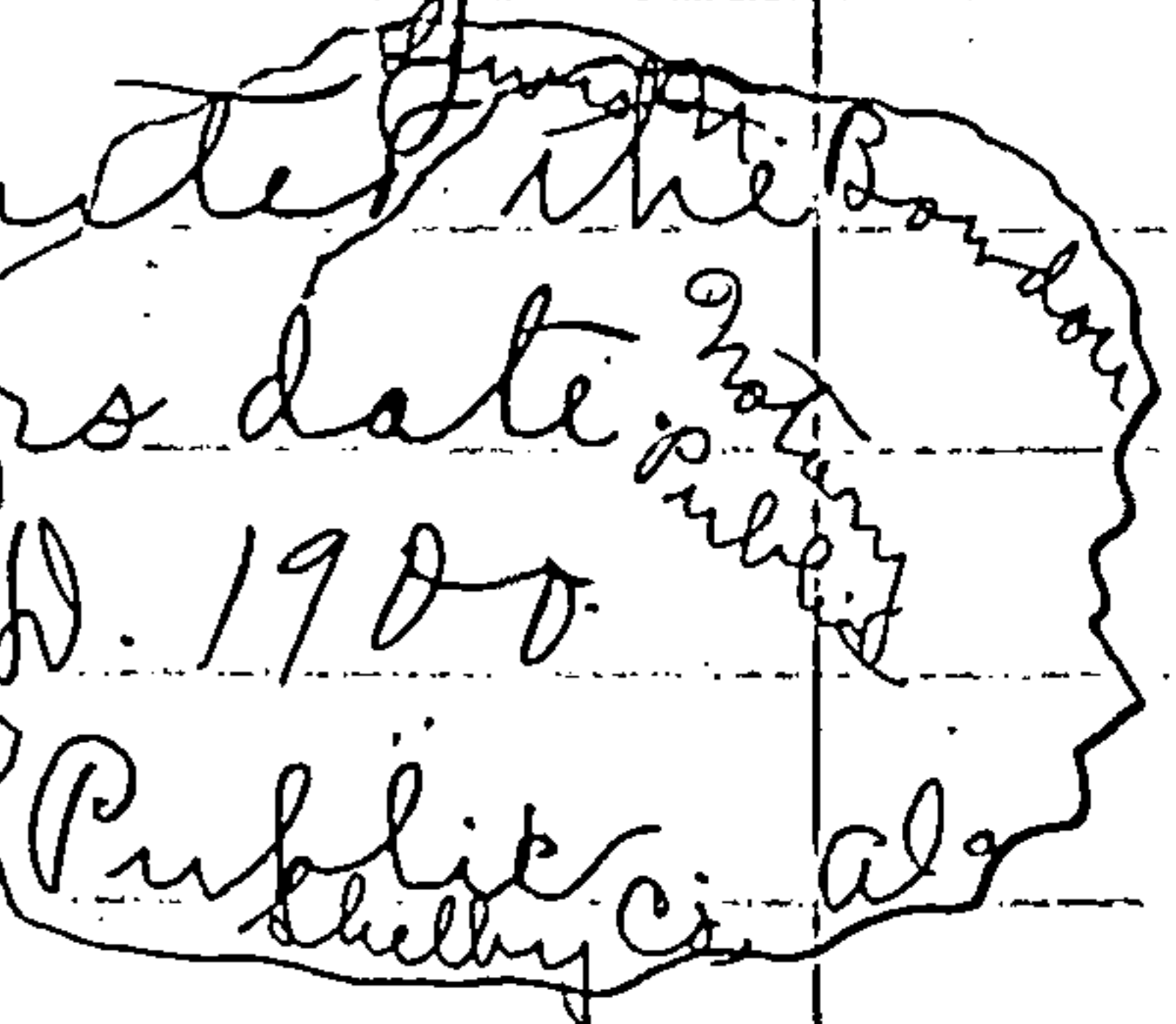
in square no fifty-two (52) in the Reynolds addition to the town of Montevallo situated in County, Alabama.

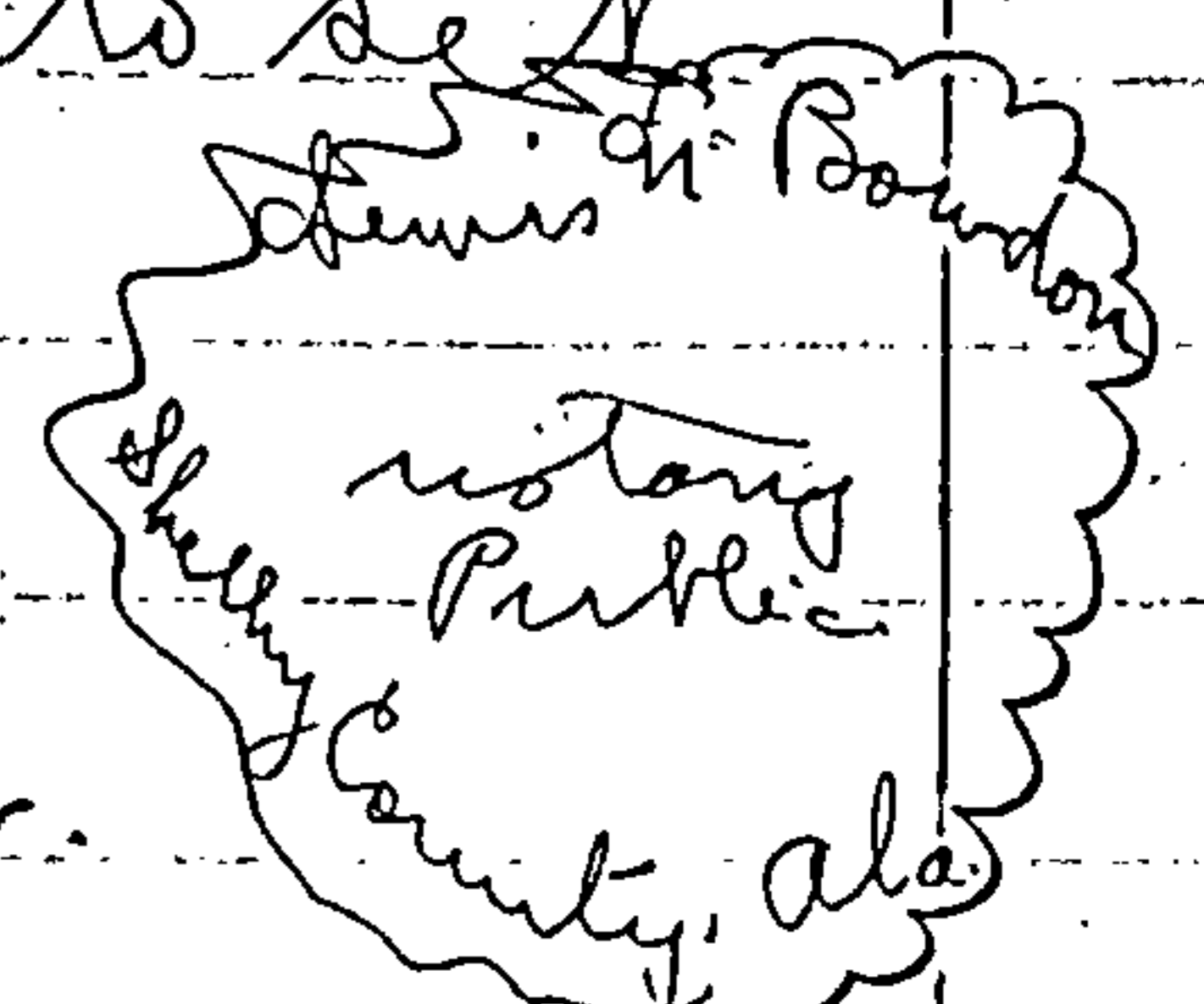
