county for and in consideration of the sum of Three hun-
dred Dollars to us in hand paid by W. W. Hollis the receipt of
which is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and do by
these presents grant bargain and sell and convey and conform
unto the said Hollis the following described tract of land sit-
uated in said county and in the Tuscaloosa land district to wit
S.E. 1/4 of the N.W. 1/4 and the N.E. 1/4 of the S.W. 1/4 and the S.E. 1/4 of
Section 36 of Township 18 of Range one East 240 acres more
or less, to have and to hold the said tract of land unto
the said Hollis his heirs and assigns forever and we the said
M. G. Johnson and Mary Johnson the wife of said M. G. Johnson
do covenant and agree with the said Hollis that the said
tract of land are free from incumbrances that we have
a good right thereto and to sell the same to the said Hollis
and we will in consideration of the premises by these
presents even defend the right and title to said tract
of land unto the said W. W. Hollis his heirs and assigns
against the lawful claims and demands of all persons whosoever.
