 containing Eighty acres more or less, situated in St. Clair
 County. ^{Alab.} To have and to hold, to the said John R. Dyke, his
 heirs and assigns forever. And I do, for my heirs, executors
 and administrators, covenant with the said John R. Dyke
 his heirs and assigns, that I am lawfully seized in fee
 simple of said premises; that they are free from all incum-
 brances, and that I have a good right to sell and convey

 and administrators shall, warrant and defend the same to
