for and in consideration of Fifteen Hundred DOLLARS,  
to W. B. Parker the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do Grant, Bargain, Sell  
and Convey unto the said W. B. Parker  
the following described property, to-wit:

A part of the west half of north west fourth  
of section 25, Township 21, Range 1 west and more particularly  
described as follows to-wit: Beginning at an Iron Stake at the north East  
corner of W. B. Parker's lot (known as the White House Hotel lot) and  
running in a southerly direction to a large ditch, thence in an  
easterly direction along said ditch to the west boundary line of the  
land now owned by James H. Page; thence in a northerly  
direction along said J. H. Page's line to East College Street Thence in  
a westerly direction along College Street to where Spencer House  
Street intersects College Street; thence along said Spencer House Street  
south 11 1/2 degrees East 198 feet; thence along said Street south 42 1/2 degrees West  
149 feet to starting point, except one acre of land beginning at an iron stake  
1/2 feet East from the north East corner of the said W. B. Parker's lot, and  
running Easterly 200 feet to an Iron Stake and thence in a southerly direction 210 feet  
to an Iron Stake; thence in a westerly direction 200 feet, thence in a northerly direction
