} Oct 3 & 1876, came the

} E Edward H. Walker, foreman & eleven
others, who being empaneled, sworn

& charged, well & truly to try the issue joined upon their
oathes do say, We the jury find the issue in favor of the
plaintiff for the following lands to wit: the S E $\frac{1}{4}$ of the S E $\frac{1}{4}$
of Section three also that part of the East half of the North
West quarter Section ten (10) and all that part of the North
East quarter of North West quarter of section fifteen, all
in Township ~~the~~ twenty, range three West which lies
West of the top of a certain ridge, known as the gold
ridge, containing about 80 acres more or less, to be the
property of the Plaintiff, and we find for the plaintiff
the entire right to all the coal that may be on
the following described lands to wit: The East half
of the South East quarter of section ten, all that
part of the North East quarter of section fifteen (12)
which lies North of Buck creek, and a part of the
South East of North West, supposed to be three acres
more or less, and the North West quarter of section
eleven (11) and the North East quarter of South West
quarter of section eleven (11) and the North East
quarter of the North East quarter of section ten (10)
and the South West $\frac{1}{4}$ of South East quarter & N W $\frac{1}{4}$
of S E $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 10 and E $\frac{1}{2}$ of the S W $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 10 & N E $\frac{1}{4}$
of N W $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec 12, Township 20, Range 3 West.
which lies East of the gold Ridge. It is therefore
considered by the court, that the Plaintiff have
and recover of the Defendants the following
described lands to wit: The S E $\frac{1}{4}$ of the S E $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec
3, also that part of the E $\frac{1}{2}$ of N W $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 10, and all
that part of the N E $\frac{1}{4}$ of N W $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 12, all in

Township 20 Range 3 West, which lies West of the top of a certain Ridge known as the gold ridge, containing about 80 acres more or less, lying and being in the County of Shelby and State of Alabama, and to have and recover of said Defendant the entire right to all the coal that may be in the following described lands to wit: The $E\frac{1}{4}$ of the $S\ E\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 10 and all that part of the $N\ E\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 10 which lies North of Buck Creek, and a part of the $S\ E\frac{1}{4}$ of $N\ W\frac{1}{4}$; supposed to be three acres more or less and the $N\ W\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 11 and the $N\ E\frac{1}{4}$ of $N\ W\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 11 and the $N\ E\frac{1}{4}$ of $N\ E\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 10 and the $S\ W\frac{1}{4}$ of $S\ E\frac{1}{4}$, and the $N\ W\frac{1}{4}$ of $S\ E\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 10, and the $E\frac{1}{2}$ of $S\ W\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 10 and the $N\ E\frac{1}{4}$ of $N\ W\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 10 Township 20, Range Three West, which lies East of the Gold Ridge, and that if the possession of said lands is not delivered within fifteen days from the rendition of this judgment, let a writ of possession issue for the lands recovered by this judgment. It is further considered by the Court that each party recover his costs in this behalf expended, for which let execution issue.
