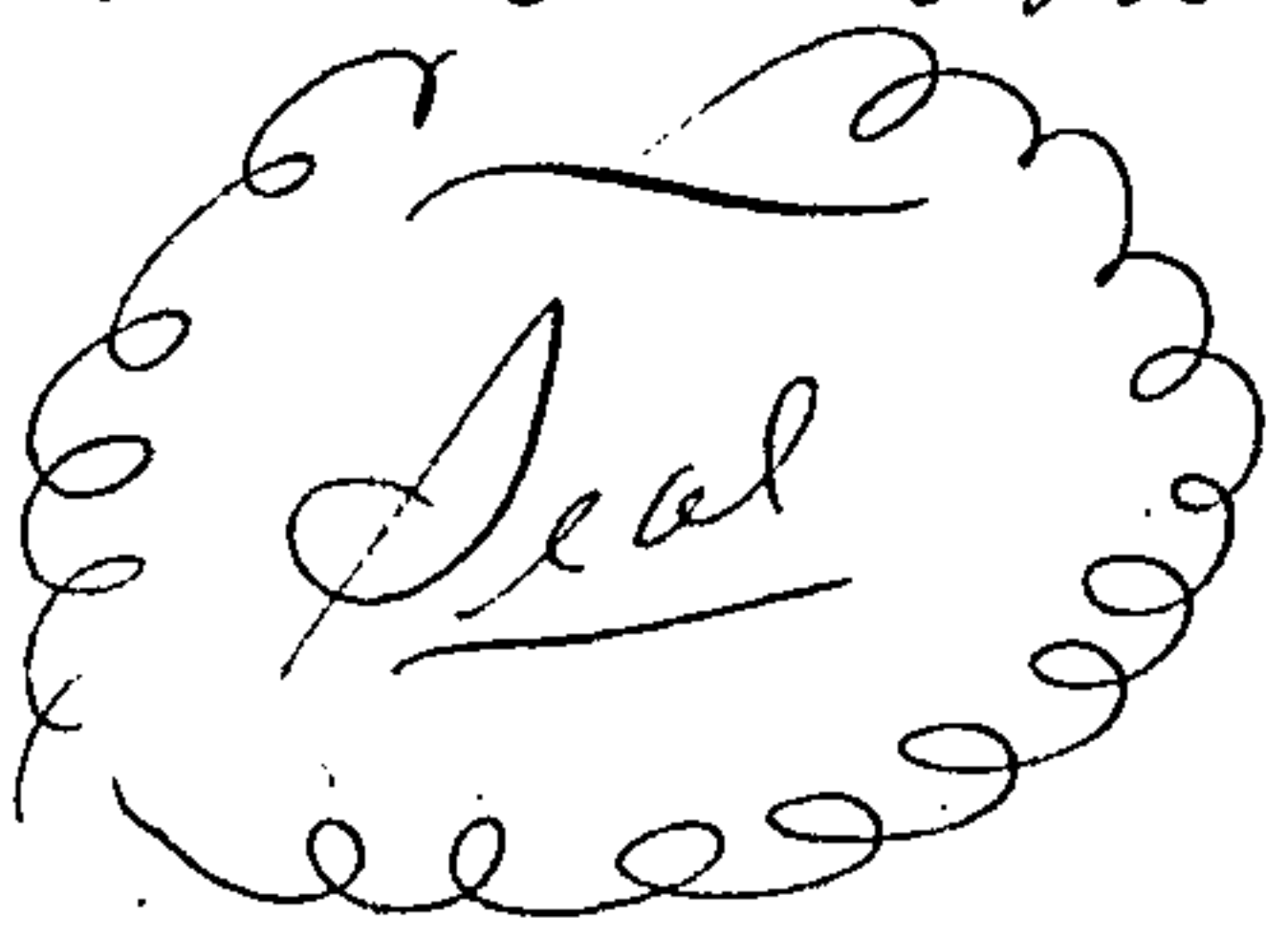
To all to whom these Presents shall come greeting.
 Whereas David A. Seal of Shelby County, Alabama, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Montgomery, Alabama, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said David A. Seal according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April 1820, entitled "An Act making further provisions for the sale of the Public Lands" and the Acts supplemental thereto, for the north west quarter of Section twenty, in township twenty two south, of Range four west of Hunterville meridian in Alabama containing one hundred & fifty nine acres and twenty two hundredths of an acre - according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General which said tract has

been purchased by the said David A. Seale.

Now know ye, that the United States of America in consideration of the premises, And in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given & granted And by these presents do give & grant unto the said David A. Seale, And to his heirs, the said Trust, above described; To have and to hold the same together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging unto the said David A. Seale and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof I Grover Cleveland President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made patent And the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand at the City of Washington the fifth day of August in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred And eighty five And of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and tenth.
