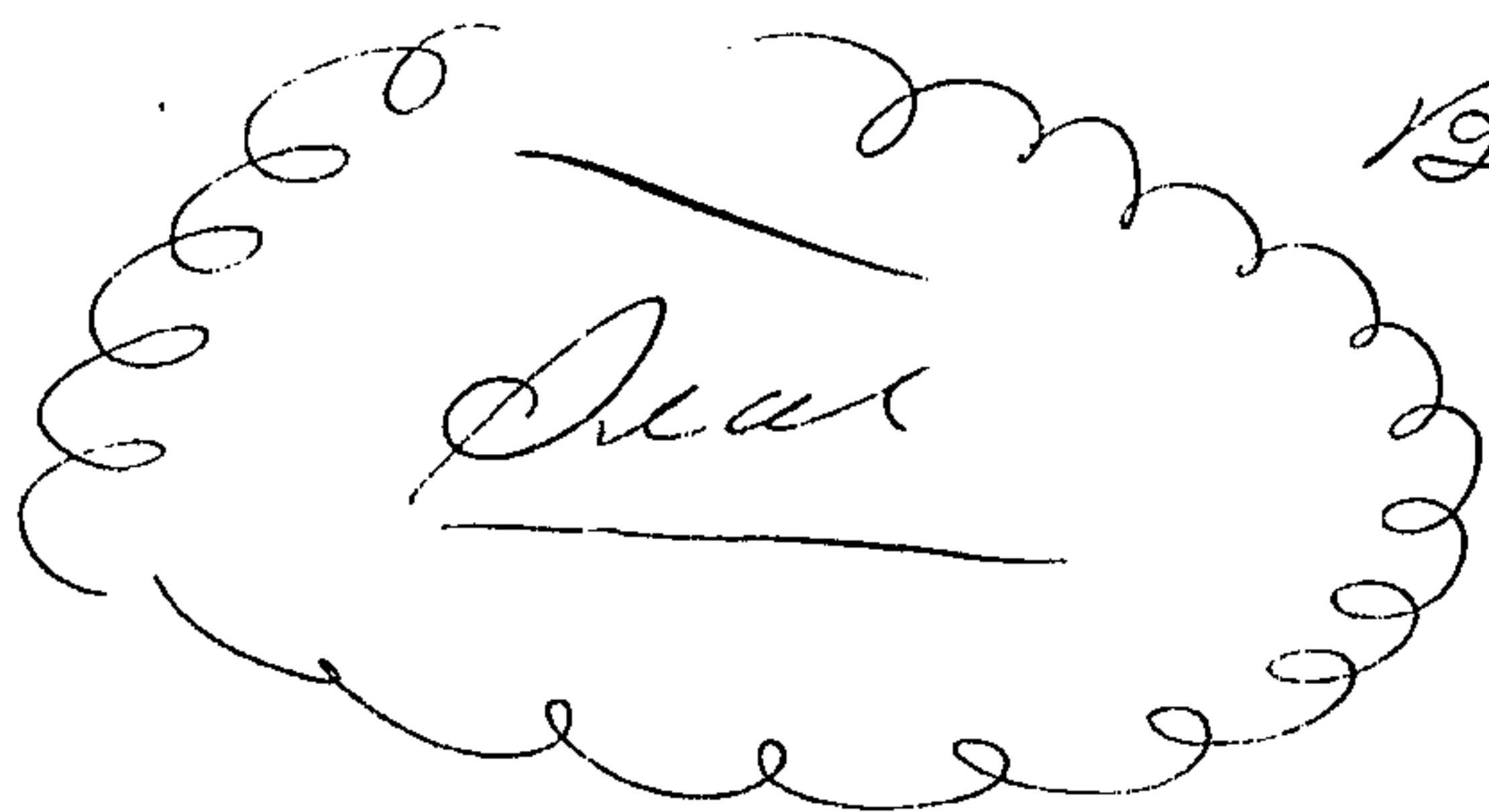
To all to whom these presents shall come greeting:
 Whereas Edward J. Watts of Dallas County, Alabama, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Edward J. Watts according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April 1820, entitled "An act making further provisions for the Sale of public Lands for the South East quarter of the South west quarter and the South west quarter of the South East quarter of Section One, and the North west quarter of the North east quarter and the East half of the North East quarter ^{and} the ~~South~~ ^{North} East quarter of the South East quarter of Section Twelve, in ~~the~~ Township Twenty two of Range four west and the West half of the North west quarter of Section Seven in Township Twenty two of Range three west in the District of lands subject to sale, at Tuscaloosa Alabama, containing three Hundred and nineteen acres and ninety six hundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General and which said tracts have been purchased by the said Edward J. Watts.

Now know ye! That the United States of America in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made & provided have given & granted & by these presents do give & grant unto the said

Edward T. Watts and to his heirs, the said Tracts above described: To have and to hold the same together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereto belonging unto the said Edward T. Watts and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof I James Buchanan President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made ~~forth~~ and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto Affixed.

Given under my hand at the City of Washington the first day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & fifty Eight and of the Independence of the United States the Eighty Second.
