 a corporation, the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, have
 granted, bargained, sold and conveyed, and by these presents
 do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Gulf
 Red Cedar Company, its successors and assigns, all the
 cedar timber and cedar trees now standing, growing or lying
 down, or fallen, from 6 inches in diameter up or greater, in
 and upon the following described lands, situated in the County
 of Shelby, State of Alabama, to-wit: $N\frac{1}{2}$ S. $W\frac{1}{4}$ S. $W\frac{1}{4}$ of
 $N\frac{1}{4}$ and S. $E\frac{1}{4}$ of $N\frac{1}{4}$ Sec 36 - T. 19. R. 3 W. - S. $E\frac{1}{4}$ of S. $E\frac{1}{4}$ Sec
 35 T. 19. R. 3 W. together with the right to free ingress, egress and
 regress for the said Gulf Red Cedar Company, their successors
 and assigns, and their agents, servants, employees, and
 workmen, with cars, wagons, carts and other vehicles, teams,
 mills, machinery, tools, implements and instruments, to, on,
 over and through, and from the said above described lands

and all other lands of the said grantors, adjoining to or contiguous to the said lands, (and which it may be necessary to go on through and over, in passing to and from said above described lands), for the purpose of getting, cutting, sawing, manufacturing, removing, using and otherwise disposing of the said cedar timber and cedar trees herein sold and conveyed; at all times and seasons without let or hindrance on the part of the said grantors, their heirs and assigns, provided that their fences on said lands are not left down or injured or destroyed, and their farming operations on said lands are not interfered with, and they are not otherwise unduly and improperly annoyed, or their fields damaged by hauling across them; and also together with the further right and privilege to the said grantees, their successors and assigns to put mills, houses and machinery upon said lands for the purpose of manufacturing and otherwise working up said cedar timber and cedar trees and lodging, housing and sheltering their employees, servants, workmen, teams, machinery, tools, implements, cars, carts, wagons and other property, with the right to remove said mills, houses, shelters, machinery, and other improvements put by them upon said lands, provided that the said grantees, their successors and assigns, are to get and remove, or work up, manufacture and remove, or cut and remove from said lands the said cedar timber and cedar trees herein sold and conveyed, within four months from the date and delivery of this deed of conveyance. To have and to hold the aforegranted property to the said Gulf Red Cedar Company, their successors and assigns forever. And we do covenant with the said Gulf Red Cedar Company, their successors and assigns, that I am lawfully seized in fee of the aforegranted property; that they are free from all incumbrance, that I have a good right to sell and convey the same to the said Gulf Red Cedar Company, their successors and assigns; and that I will warrant and defend the premises to the said Gulf Red Cedar Company, their successors and assigns forever, against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.
