 Shelby County . } Know all men by these presents, Whereas,
 on, to-wit, the 25th day of November, 1901, the undersigned, Mabel
 Wooten and her husband John E. Wooten, sold to J. M. Bearden cer-
 tain lands hereinafter described and conveyed, and executed and
 delivered to said Bearden a deed intending therein and thereby to describe
 and convey the said lands, but by mistake or inadvertance of
 the draughtsman the same was inaccurately and incorrectly de-
 scribed; Now, therefore, in consideration of the premises, to quiet
 the title to said lands and to correct said error and properly
 convey the said lands and for the further consideration of the
 sum of one dollar to each of us in hand paid by the said
 J. M. Bearden, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, we,
 the said Mabel Wooten and J. E. Wooten, her husband, do hereby
 remise, release, quit-claim and convey unto the said J. M. Bearden,
 the following described land lying and being in said County and
 State to-wit: The Northwest quarter of the Southwest quarter of
 Section Ten (10) except six & $\frac{7}{100}$ acres in the northeast corner
 thereof described as follows: Beginning at a point on the
 east boundary line of said forty acres, 10 chs. and 50 lks
 south of the northeast corner thereof thence running west
 2 chs and 67 lks to a post, thence north 35° west 12 chs and
 25 lks to the north boundary line of said forty and thence
 along the north boundary line of said forty eastward to the
 point of beginning; also excepting a triangular piece of
 land in the northwest corner of said forty containing one
 and $\frac{6}{100}$ acres and known as the Dummer homestead). Also
 all of the N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ that lies west of Shoal Creek
 and all of the S. $\frac{1}{2}$ of S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ that lies north of what is known
 as the Bowdon Spring Branch, in said Section Ten (10);
 Also eleven and $\frac{10}{100}$ acres in the south east corner of N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$
 of S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of section Nine (9) measuring $11\frac{7}{10}$ $\frac{10}{100}$ chains east and
 west and 10 chains north and south, all in Township Twenty
 two (22) South, Range Three (3) West, and containing fifty-five
 acres more or less. To have and to hold unto the
 said J. M. Bearden, his heirs and assigns forever.
