TO HAVE AND TO HOLD to the SAID James M. Jones his heirs and assigns forever. And we do for our heirs, executors and administrators, covenant with said Jas M. Jones his heirs and assigns that we are lawfully seized in fee simple of said premises; that they are free from all encumbrances, and that we have a good right to sell and convey the same as aforesaid; that we will and our heirs executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said Jas M. Jones his heirs, and executors and assigns forever, against the lawful claims of all persons.
