

The State of Alabama, Whereas, on the 7th day
 Montgomery County, of August, 1873, The Mon-
 tervally Coal Mining Company by deed con-
 veyed to B. F. Noble and Andrew J. Noble, as
 co-partners doing business under the name
 and style of Noble & Brother, certain real
 estate containing four hundred acres,
 more or less, situate in the County of
 Shelby, State of Alabama, which deed is
 recorded in the office of said Judge of
 Probate of Shelby County, Alabama, in B. S.
 Page 255; and Whereas, afterwards, to wit:
 on the 19th day of August, 1878, the said
 B. F. Noble and the said Andrew J. Noble agreed
 to a division of said lands, each reciv-
 ing and gaining into possession of two hun-
 dred acres thereof, and mutually execu-
 ting quit claim deeds, releasing and
 quit claiming all right and title to
 the lands of the other; and where as, pur-
 suant to said division, said Andrew
 J. Noble and Mary G. Noble, his wife, on
 said 19th day of Aug, 1878, executed and de-
 livered unto the said Benjamin F. Noble, their
 quit claim deed, releasing and quit claim-
 ing to him all the right, title and interest
 they had in and to the lands so assigned on
 said division thereof to said B. F. Noble,
 which deed is recorded in the office of the
 Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama,
 in Book 22, of Deeds, page 242; and
 whereas, by oversight, some of the lands
 conveyed are incorrectly described in
 said deed; and whereas, the said Andrew
 J. Noble and Mary G. Noble have since died;
 and whereas, the said B. F. Noble has since
 died, and his widow, Mary F. Noble is the ex-
 ecutrix of his will, and has requested us as
 the sole surviving heirs of the said Andrew
 J. Noble to execute to her another deed,

correctly describing said land so taken possession of by said B. F. Noble on said division, which we are willing to do; Now, therefore, We, A. S. Noble and Kate P. Noble, his wife, Florence N. Peebles and W. E. Peebles, her husband, and Sarah E. Nobles, being all the heirs at law of said Andrew J. Noble, for and in consideration of the sum of five dollars to us in hand paid by Mary J. Noble, executrix of the will of B. F. Nobles, deceased, do remise, release, quit claim and convey to said Mary J. Nobles, as executrix of the will of B. F. Noble, deceased, all of our right, title, interest and claim in and to the following described lands situate in the County of Shelby and State of Alabama, to wit: The South half of the North west quarter; North half of South west quarter, South west quarter of North east quarter, section 29, Township 21 Range 4, E. 3. N. To have and to hold unto the said Mary J. Noble, as executrix afore said, her successors and assigns, forever.
