 grantors N. H. Dennis and his wife Nancy Dennis
 in hand paid by George W. Armstrong, the receipt
 whereof is acknowledged, we the said N. H. Dennis
 and his wife Nancy Dennis do grant, bargain, sell
 and convey unto the said George W. Armstrong the
 following described real estate, to-wit: the south east
 fourth of the south west fourth and the south half of
 the north east fourth of the south west fourth of section
 5 - Township 20 - Range 2 West, and the North West fourth
 and the North half of the south west fourth of section
 8 - Township 20 - Range 2 West, all pine timber above
 ten inches in diameter is hereby expressly reserved
 to the grantors together with the right of way through
 said land for building roads sufficient to remove
 said timber off of said land, also for the mill to be
 and remain on said premises to saw the timber on

said land till August 1906, all of said land being situated in Shelby County, Alabama. To have and to hold, to the said George W. Armstrong their heirs and assigns forever. And we do, for our heirs, executors and administrators, covenant with the said George W.
