 Shelby County, } day of November in the year
 of our Lord, One thousand, eight
 hundred and sixty-six, between William Whitfield
 and Polly Whitfield his wife of the first part and
 Samuel Howard of the second part, all of State and County
 aforesaid, Witnesseth: that the said party of the first
 part for and in consideration of the sum of Two hun-
 dred dollars to them in hand paid by the party of the
 second part, the receipt is hereby acknowledged, have
 this day aforesaid that bargained sold and conveyed
 and by these presents doth bargain, sell, convey and
 deliver unto the said party of the second part and to
 his and assigns all that tract or parcel of land lying
 and being in the State and County aforesaid viz:
 being the S. W. 1/4 of the S. W. 1/4 of Township 3 and S. W. 1/4
 N. W. 1/4 of Township Section 10 in Township 19 - Range 1 West,
 containing 79 acres & 83/100 of an acre in Tuscaloosa Land
 District. To have and to hold the above bargained premises
 to him the party of the second part and to his heirs &
 assigns forever and to his only proper use and behoof
 thereof together with all and singular and all ap-
 pertaining thereto, and we the said parties of the first
 do warrant and defend the rights of the above bargained
 premises to the said party of the second part from
 ourselves our heirs and assigns and all and every
 person or persons whatsoever.
