the register of the Land office at Montgomery Alabama, whereby
it appears that pursuant to the act of congress approved
20th May 1862, to secure Homesteads to actual Settlers
on the public domain; and the acts supplemental thereto
the claim of John H Jones, junior, has been

Established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the
 North half, of the North east quarter, the Northeast quarter of the
 North West quarter and the south west quarter of the North east quarter,
 of section twenty eight in Township twenty four, North of Range
 fifteen east of St Stephens Meridian in Alabama containing
 one hundred, and fifty nine acres, and eighty four hundredths
 of an acre, according to the official plat, of the survey of the said
 lands, returned to the general Land office, by the Surveyor
 General, now knowage, that there is therefore granted by the United
 States unto the said John W Jones, junior, the tract of land, above
 described; to have, and to hold, the said tract of land, with the
 appurtenances, thereof unto the said John W Jones junior, in
 testimony whereof I Grover Cleveland president of the United
 States of America have caused these letters to be made patent
 and the seal, of the General Land office to be hereunto affixed,
 given under my hand at the city of Washington the eighth
 day of March in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred
 and ninety four, and of the independence of the United States the
 one hundred, and eighteenth.
