we are, lawfully seized in fee simple of said premises;
that they are free from all incumbrances; that we, have
a good right to sell, and convey the said property; that
we, will and our heirs executors and administrators,
shall warrant and defend the same, to said
R. H. Glaze, his heirs, executors and assigns forever, against
the lawful claims of all persons whatsoever, given
