 Shelby County, { this 1st day of February A. D. 1859, between
 Amos Merrell Jr. and Elizabeth Merrell,
 husband and wife, of the first part and Charles M. Corden
 of the second part, witnesses: That the said parties of the
 first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Two
 hundred and sixty-two dollars to them in hand paid by
 the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is
 hereby acknowledged, have sold, and hereby sell, confirm
 and convey unto the said party of the second part the
 following described land lying in Shelby County, State
 of Alabama, to-wit: The N E $\frac{1}{4}$ of the North East fourth,
 of Section twelve, Township 24 - Range 15 - East and
 ten acres on the North East corner of Section seven,
 Township twenty-four of Range 16 East. To have and
 to hold to said second party, his heirs and assigns
 forever the above described and hereby granted lands, and
 premises. And the said parties of the first part, husband and
 wife, hereby covenant with the said party of the second part,
 that we are lawfully seized of, and have good right to sell
 and convey said land, and hereby bind ourselves, our
 heirs and legal representatives forever, to warrant and de-
 fend the title to said land and premises to the said
 party of the second part, his heirs, assigns and legal
 representatives, against the claim of all and every person
 in law or Equity, and against the government of the United
 States.
