 day of February A.D. 1856, between Nedham Lee and his wife
 Nancy Lee of the first part, and Malden Roy
 of the second part, all of the County and State
 aforesaid, witnesses: that the said party of the
 first part hath this day bargained, sold and de-
 livered by these presents grant, bargain, sell unto the
 party of the second part, a certain tract or
 parcel of land lying and being in the County
 of Shelby and State of Alabama (to-wit) all
 that part of the $\frac{1}{2}$ - S.E. quarter, also the South
 East end of the N. $\frac{1}{2}$ of the N.E. quarter,
 five acres more or less, in Section Ten - also
 the North West quarter of the South West quarter
 Section Eleven, also the South East fourth of
 the North East quarter, Section Ten, Township
 Twenty of Range Three West, for the consideration
 of the sum of five hundred and fifty dollars,
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, and
 the said party of the first part doth for them-
 selves, their heirs, executors, administrators and

assigns with warrant and defend the title of said lands unto the said party of the second part his heirs & C, together with all that appertains unto said land. In testimony whereof we have hereunto set our names and affixed our seals, day and year first above written.
