On 2nd day April 1911, I promise to Pay H. A. Worthy or order, the Just, and full sum of Two Hundred Dollars, Value Received, Payable at Columbiana Savings Bank, Columbiana Alabama. The Parties to this instrument, whether maker, endorser, surety or guarantor each for himself hereby severally waives as to this debt or any renewal thereof, all rights of exemption under the Constitution and Laws of Alabama, as to personal property, and to claim any wages and chose in action, as exempt from garnishment or other legal process to subject the same and they each severally agree to pay all costs of collecting, or securing, or attempting to collect, or secure this note, including a reasonable attorney's fee, whether the same be collected or secured by suit, or otherwise, And the maker, endorser, surety or guarantor of this note severally waives demand, presentment, protest, notice of protest, suit and all other requirements necessary to hold them, and they agree that the time of Payment may be extended without notice to them of such extension, and they severally assent to the terms shown on the face of this note, and they further agree that upon failure to pay this note at maturity, all obligations owing by them, or either of them to the Payee jointly or severally, may at once, at the option of the Payee, become due, payable, and collectable, but this shall not operate to make them liable for interest, or discount, on such obligations, beyond the date of Collection thereof, and any unearned interest or discount, that has been prepaid must be refunded or credited on the obligation. The Bank at which this note is payable is hereby authorized to apply, on or after maturity, to the Payment of this debt, any funds in said Bank belonging to the maker, endorser, guarantor or any one of them.
