

this Indenture, made and entered into this the first day of October A. D. 1907, by and between H. V. Douglass and her husband G. M. Douglass, Shelby Co, State of Alabama, of the first part, and Sam Thomas and his wife Sally Thomas of the County of Shelby and State of Alabama of the second part, Witnesseth; that the said A. V. Douglass and G. M. Douglass for and in consideration of the sum of eight hundred and sixty two & 8/100 dollars to them in hand paid by the party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have this day granted, bargained, sold, aliened and conveyed

enfeoffed and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, enfeoff and convey to the said Saml Thomas and Sally Thomas all that certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Shelby and State of Alabama, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit: The S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 1, Tp. 20, R. 3 E. containing forty acres; also that portion of the N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 7, Tp. 20 - R. 3 East which lies south of the settlement road leading from what is known as the Judge place to the Harpersville public road, and west of the Central of Ga. R. R. and that portion of the S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 6, Tp. 20 - R. 3 East, and that portion of the N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 7, Tp. 20, R. 3 East, all of which lies West of the Central of Ga. R. R. in Shelby County, Alabama. This being no part of the Judge homestead, and never occupied as such, containing 65 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres, more or less.

To have and to hold, the above described tract or parcel of land, together with the tenements and appurtenances thereto belonging, or otherwise appertaining unto the said party of the second part, their heirs and assigns forever. And the said A. V. Douglass and G. M. Douglass of the first part, for themselves, their heirs, executors and administrators do warrant and will forever defend the title to the above described and hereby granted premises unto the said party of the second part, their heirs and assigns, from and against themselves, and all and every person claiming or holding under them, the said party of the first part, and against the lawful title, claim or demand of all and every person whosoever claiming or holding by form or under the Government of the United States.
