that, whereas, at the March  
Term, of the Chancery Court, held for the Sixth

decree was rendered by said Court on the 15th day  
of March, 1909, in a cause then pending in said  
Court, wherein Southern Mineral Land Company,  
a Corporation, was Complainant and the heirs of

ants, which said decree directed the undersigned  
J. R. White, Register in Chancery of the Sixth District

of the Northeastern Chancery Division of the State of Alabama to execute and deliver unto the said Southern Mineral Land Company a deed Conveying to it all the right title and interest of said defendants, the said heirs of William B. King and of Anna B. Wilson, in and to the N. W  $\frac{1}{4}$  of S. E  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 7, Township 21, Range 3 West, S. W  $\frac{1}{4}$  of S. W  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 7, Township 21, Range 3 West, N. W  $\frac{1}{4}$  of N. W  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 18, Township 21, Range 3 West, N. W  $\frac{1}{4}$  of N. E  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 20, Township 21, Range 3 West, all of said lands being situated in Shelby County, Alabama. And, Whereas, it was provided in said decree that said decree shall not become absolute for a period of twelve months from the date of the rendition thereof; and, whereas, it was further provided that the Register of said Court should send a copy of the same to said defendants as required by Section 753 of the Code of Alabama, provided their residences could be ascertained; and whereas, more than twelve months have passed since the rendition of said decree; and whereas, the undersigned Register in Chancery has been unable to ascertain the names and residences of said defendants. Now, therefore, in consideration of the premises, and by virtue of said decree, and the further consideration of the sum of two (\$2.00) dollars, received to my full satisfaction of said Southern Mineral Land Company, I, the said J. R. White, as Register in Chancery of the Sixth District of the Northeastern Chancery Division of the State of Alabama, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and Convey unto the said Southern Mineral Land Company all the right title and interest of said heirs of William B. King and Anna B. Wilson, in and to the lands described above. To have and to hold unto the said Southern Mineral Land Company, its assigns and successors forever.
