Certificate No. To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:
25, 860. Whereas William B. King, Barney M. McHenry,
and John W. Lapsley of Dallas County, Alabama have deposited
in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the
Register of the Land Office, at Tuscaloosa, whereby it appears

that full payment has been made by the said William B. King, Barney M. McHenry and John W. Lapsley according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the North west quarter of the North west quarter of Section eighteen, in Township twenty one of Range three west in the District of lands subject to sale at Tuscaloosa, Alabama containing Thirty eight acres and ninety and a half hundredths of an acre according to the official Plat of the survey of said lands, returned to the General Land office by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said William B. King, Barney M. McHenry, and John W. Lapsley, now, Know ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said William B. King, Barney M. McHenry and John W. Lapsley and to their heirs, the said Tract above described To Have and To Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereto belonging, unto the said William B. King, Barney M. McHenry and John W. Lapsley as tenants in common, and not as joint tenants and to their heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony whereof, I Willard Fillmore President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land office to be hereunto affixed.
