two hundred and ten dollars to us in hand paid by the  
party of the second part the receipt whereof is hereby ac-  
knowledged do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey  
unto the said Richard W. Moore & his heirs & assigns forever  
the following described land lying and being in Shelby County,  
State of Alabama and in the Tuscaloosa Land district to wit:

the west half of north west quarter of section No. Twenty  
Township twenty Range one west.

To have and to hold said land and premises with all the  
appurtenances thereto belonging unto him the said Richard  
W. Moore his heirs and assigns forever, we the said party  
of the first part do covenant to and with said party of the

second part that we are lawful signed of and have a right  
to sell and convey the aforesaid, said land and premises  
and that we will forever warrant and defend title to the  
aforesaid land and premises against all and every  
person or persons in law or equity and against the  
Government of the United States of America. In testimony
