

In the matter of the / In the Chancery Court of
 Petition of Phoebe Lacey (Shelby County,
 and Robert E. Lacey (This is a petition filed
 by Phoebe Lacey and Robert E. Lacey on behalf of
 the said Robert E. Lacey, a minor above the age
 of 18 years, to-wit: about the age of 19 years, the father
 of said Robert E. Lacey being dead, and he hav-
 ing no guardian, and said petition being filed
 by his mother in his behalf. It is made to
 appear to the Chancellor by the petition and
 evidence that a publication of notice is not
 necessary under this petition, and therefore
 no such publication is ordered. The Court ex-
 amined the said petition and the Affidavits
 of others filed therewith, and being satisfied
 that said minor is of sufficient intelligence
 to be entrusted with the management of
 his estate, and that it would be to the in-
 terest to grant the prayer of the petition.

It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed
 that the said Robert E. Lacey, a minor over
 the age of 18 years, he and he is hereby relieved
 from the disabilities of non-age, and is now in-
 vested with the right to contract, sue and

be used, to buy, sell and convey real estate, and to do and perform all acts which said minor could lawfully do on his becoming the age of 21 years.

This order and decree, however, is not to take effect until a copy of this decree shall be filed and recorded in the Office of the Judge of Probate, as required by law, in each County where said minor may reside or do business.

It is further ordered and decreed that the petitioner pay the costs of these proceedings.
