 Shelby County Into this the 26th day of Aug-
 ust A.D. 1869 between James Boxley & Wneyford Boxley
 husband & wife of the first part & Joshua Speermon
 of the second part all of the State & County
 aforesaid, Witnesseth that the said parties of
 the first part for and in consideration
 of the sum of Two Hundred & forty Dollars
 to them in hand paid by the said party
 of the second part, the receipt whereof is
 hereby acknowledged, have bargained, sold
 and conveyed unto the said party of
 the second part the following tract of
 land to-wit:-

The S $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of section Thirty Two in
 Township nineteen of Range one East except
 the Lot deeded to the Methodist Church.
 To Have and to hold to the said party of the
 second part, his heirs and assigns forever
 and we the said parties of the first part
 do covenant with the said party of the
 second part, that we are lawfully seized

of and have a good right to sell and convey said
 Land & premises, that they are free from all in-
 cumbrances; That we ourselves our heirs and as-
 signs will warrant and forever defend the title
 of the same to the said party of the second
 part his heirs and assigns against the law-
 ful claims of all persons in Law or in Equity and
 against the Government of the United States.

 Boxley & Winneyford Boxley have hereunto
 set our Hands & Seals the day and date above
 written.
