

State of Alabama, I know all men by these Presents, That,
 Shelby County, Whereas, at the - September, 1908, Term
 of the Chancery Court, held for the sixth District of the
 North Alabama Chancery division of the State of Alabama, at
 Columbiana, a decree was rendered by said Court on
 the 30th day of October, 1908, in a cause then pending in
 said Court, wherein Fausheen Mineral Land Company,
 a Corporation, was Plaintiff, and J. C. Wallace James
 P. Wallace, F. M. Wallace, Mary Jane Stewart Thomas M.
 Wallace, Dora Abernathy, Tillie Bennett, Ida Wallace,
 Warren Wallace, Thomas Wallace Dick Wallace, Bella
 Wallace, the heirs of Warren Wallace, deceased, H. C.
 Reynolds and William B. Reynolds were defendants,
 which said decree directed the undersigned J. R.
 White, Register in Chancery of the North Alabama Chan-
 cery Division of the State of Alabama, to execute and
 deliver unto the said Fausheen Mineral Land Company
 a deed conveying to it, all the right title and interest of
 said defendants in and to all the minerals stone Coal
 and mineral deposits which is a part of a certain tract
 of land situated in Shelby County, Alabama, described
 as follows, to wit: $\frac{1}{2}$ of S. $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 24, Township
 21- Range 5 West, together with all timber and shrubs
 now growing or hereafter to grow on said land,
 necessary for mining purposes, building bridges,
 causes roads, fences and buildings; opening and re-
 pairing roads, trams and ways on said land; and
 the right and privilege to dig mine, excavate and trans-
 port said Minerals and Mineral deposits for on
 and over said land; together with all the rights
 of way of ingress and egress to and over the same;
 together with all the rights, powers and privileges

E. Wallace at Old Town, Miss., James P. Wallace, at Franks, Okla., F. M. Wallace at Holloway, Miss., Thomas M. Wallace at Kress, Ark., Dora Abernathy at Oldtown Mississippi, Lillie Bennett at Oldtown Mississippi, Ida Wallace as an individual and as the mother of Warren Wallace, Thomas Wallace, Dick Wallace and Bella Wallace at Kress, Ark., the respective residences of said defendants as shown by affidavit of solicitor for complainant attached to the original bill in said cause; and, whereas, the undersigned Register in Chancery has been unable to ascertain the residence of the said heirs of Warren Wallace deceased. Now, therefore, in consideration of the premises, and by virtue of said decree, and the further consideration of the sum of two dollars, which has been received to my full satisfaction of the said Southern Mineral Land Company, I J. R. White, Register in Chancery of the Sixth District of the Northeastern Chancery Division of the State of Alabama, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Southern Mineral Land Company all the right, title and interest

of said J. E. Wallace, James P. Wallace, F. M. Wallace, Mary Jane
 Edward, Thomas M. Wallace, Dora Abernathy, Lillie Bennett,
 Ida Wallace, Warren Wallace, Thomas Wallace, Dick Wallace, Ella
 Wallace, the heirs of Warren Wallace, deceased, H. C. Reynolds
 and William B. Reynolds, in and to the lands described
 above. To have and to hold unto the said Southern Mineral
 Land Company, its assigns and successors forever.
