 No. 10.358 } To all to whom these Presents shall come, greeting:  
 Whereas David Meredith, of Shelby County, has deposited in the  
 General Land Office of the United States, a Certificate of the Gen-  
 eral Land Office at Tuscaloosa, whereby it appears that  
 full payment has been made by the said David Meredith  
 according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the  
 2d April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision  
 for the Sale of the Public Lands," for The North West quarter  
 of the North East quarter of Section Twenty-eight in Township  
 Twenty, of Range Three West, in the District of Lands subject  
 to sale at Tuscaloosa, Alabama containing forty acres and  
 thirty one and a half hundredths of an acre, according  
 to the official plat of the Survey of the said lands, return-  
 ed to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General,  
 which said tract has been purchased by the said David  
 Meredith. Now know ye, that the United States of America, in  
 consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the  
 several acts of Congress, in such cases made and provided  
 how ever and granted, and by these, Presents do give and  
 grant unto the said David Meredith and to his heirs,  
 the said tract above described, to have and to hold the  
 same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities  
 and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto be-

longing, unto the said David Merideth and to his heirs and assigns forever. In testimony whereof, I Andrew Jackson, President of the United States of America, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed - Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the first day of October, in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand, eight hundred and thirty five, and of the Independence of the United States the sixteenth.
