Whereas, Pleasant Henderson of Shelby County, Alabama, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office of Tuscaloosa.

Whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Pleasant Henderson, according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 2d^d of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands" for the North West quarter of the South West quarter of Section Three in Township Twenty-one of Range Four West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, containing forty acres, and ten and a half hundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General or which said tract has been purchased by the said Pleasant Henderson; Now know ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Pleasant Henderson and to his heirs, the said tract, above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, franchises, immunitiess and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said Pleasant Henderson,

and to his heirs and assigns forever. Our testimony whereof,
I, Franklin Pierce, President of the United States of America
have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the
General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
