

The State of Alabama, } Know all men by these Presents:
 Shelby County. } That I John N. Wyatt, a widower
 for and in consideration of the sum of six hundred dol-
 lars to me in hand paid by Oscar E. Wyatt, the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained
 and sold and do hereby grant bargain, sell and con-
 vey unto said Oscar E. Wyatt, the following described
 real estate lying and being in said Shelby County and
 State of Alabama, to-wit: Fifty-five (55) acres more or
 less in the North half of Section twenty-five (25) Town-
 ship twenty-one (21) Range three (3) West described as follows:
 Twenty-three and one half $23\frac{1}{2}$ acres in the South end
 of the South West quarter of the North East quarter, and

Twenty-three and one half (23 1/2) acres in the South end of the South-East quarter of the North-West quarter and eight (8) acres more or less, in the South East corner of the South-West quarter of the North-West quarter; the said eight acres lying East of Spring Creek, and the said tract of fifty-five acres being bounded as follows, to-wit: Commencing where Spring Creek crosses the line between the North half and the South half of said section Twenty-five, and running thence North along said creek to a lane separating the land hereby conveyed from the lands of William Harless; running thence East along the said lane and continuing East to the East line of the South-West quarter of the North-East quarter of said section; thence South to the said line between the North half and the South half of said section, and thence West along said last mentioned line to the point of beginning, said being a part of the tract of land heretofore known as and called the Lewis Dairy Farm. Hyatt, his heirs and assigns, against the lawful claim or demands of any and all persons whomsoever, either at law or in equity.
