Homestead Certificate

No. 21118 Application 3454 } Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office at Montgomery, Alabama, whereby it appears that pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 26th May 1862 "To secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Robert L. Brown has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the Southwest quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section Twenty-two in Township Twenty-one South, of Range Three West of the Huntville Meridian, Alabama, containing thirty-nine and ninety-three hundredths acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General; Now know ye that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Robert L. Brown the tract of land above described; To have and to hold the said tract of land with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Robert L. Brown and to his heirs and assigns forever. In Testimony whereof, I Theodore Roosevelt, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the second day of December, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seven, and of the Independence of the United States the One
