This Cause coming on to be heard or as submitted for a decree upon the petition of Southern Mineral Land Company, a Corporation, and upon the answer thereto, filed by respondents to said petition Birmingham Coal & Iron Company, a Corporation, N.W.L. Chambers, as Trustee, and Thos. J. Dryer, as trustee. After Consideration, the Court is of the Opinion that the petition is in-

litled to the relief prayed for. It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Court that all right, title and interest both in law and in equity, in and to the lands described in said petition to wit:
