

The State of Alabama, by all men by her Presents,
Shelby County. That for and in Consideration
of Twenty-five \$25. dollars to us in hand paid at
and before the delivery hereof, the receipt whereof
is hereby acknowledged, by Henry Clay Reynolds
and wife Augusta do hereby bargain, sell and grant
unto the State of Alabama, for the use of "The Alabama
Girls Industrial School", the right to dig a ditch
and lay therein a Cast iron Pipe line for conduct-
ing water from the pump station of the school, at
or near the Nelson Spring to a tank on the

grounds of the School along, or near a line run from the point on the South West Boundary of Edward F. Mulkey's land, where the pipe line crosses this boundary to the Nelson Spring lot belonging to the School, with the right to maintain this pipe line forever and to enter upon and go over the adjoining lands of the grantor herein for the purpose of repairing, laying or replacing this pipe line and keeping it in order for the service for which it is laid; lying in Montevallo, Shelby County, Alabama.
