 of Five hundred four & 62/100 Dollars,  
 to them in hand paid by the party of  
 the second part, the receipt whereof  
 is hereby acknowledged, ha — This  
 day granted, bargained, sold, aliened,  
 conveyed and conveyed, and by these



presents do grant, bargain, sell, release and convey to the said Cecil Browne; one undivided one third interest in to all these certain tracts or parcels of land lying and being in the County of Shelby and State of Alabama, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

from and against themselves, and are and every person claiming or holding under them, the said party of the first part, and against the lawful title, claim or demand of all and every person whosoever claiming or holding by, from or under the Government of the United States.
