 Woods, Frank Fowler and D. Claude Harris, and is  
 hereby vested in Complainant said Southern Mineral  
 Land Company.

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Court that Complainant pay all of the costs of this suit to be taxed by the Register for which

for execution issue.
