 No. 30/68 } To all to whom these presents shall come greeting:  
 Whereas Wilbur A. Seal of Cheffy County, Alabama  
 has deposited in the General Land Office of the United  
 States, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at  
 Tuscaloosa, whereby it appears that full payment has  
 been made by the said Wilbur A. Seal according  
 to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of  
 April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision  
 for the sale of the public lands" for the North West  
 quarter of Section Twenty six, in Township Eighteen

of Range One East, in the District of lands subject to sale  
 at Tuscaloosa Alabama, containing One hundred and  
 fifty nine acres and thirty two hundredths of an acre  
 according to the Official Plat of Survey of the said lands returned  
 to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said  
 tract, has been purchased by the said Wilburn B. Seal.  
 Now know ye, that the United States of America, in con-  
 sideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several  
 Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, Have  
 given and granted, and by these presents do give and  
 grant, unto the said Wilburn B. Seal, and to his heirs  
 the said tract above described: To have and to hold  
 the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immuni-  
 ties and appurtenances of whatsoever value thereunto be-  
 longing, unto the said Wilburn B. Seal and to his heirs  
 and assigns forever. In testimony whereof, I James  
 Buchanan, President of the United States of America, have  
 caused these letters to be made Patent and the seal of  
 the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.  
 Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the  
 first day of June in the year of Our Lord one thou-  
 sand eight hundred and fifty eight and of the Inde-  
 pendence of the United States the Eighty second.
