

Affiant State of Alabama, Person ally came before me the undersigned an-
Sheely County, Thirity John S. Stone who being duly sworn makes
oath that he knew G.W. Merrill in December 1896 and that he was
a single man on said date.
That affiant knew James Skelton and Luverna Skelton who joined
with said Merrill on December 2nd 1896 in conveying the West
half of the Northwest quarter of section 26, south of Reesvax Creek,
Township 21 South of Range 1 East in Sheely County, Alabama, to
Benjamin Harper and Lucind Harper. That the said Luverna Skel-
ton is the same person as Luverna Skelton and was one of
the grantees in the deed from J.R. Browning and wife to the above
mentioned lands, and that she was the wife of James Skelton
on November 9th, 1890.
That affiant was acquainted with Benjamin Harper and Lu-
cind Harper, and that they are the same persons who conveyed
said lands to J.M. Dugrant on December 6th 1904 and mentioned in
said deed as C.B. Harper and wife L.J. Harper.
Affiant further states that he is the same person who con-
veyed said lands in section 26, Township 21 South of Range 1 East
described in deed dated April 9th 1907 to A.G. Longhord, and
which lands were conveyed to affiant by J.N. Bushy in 1898
and that affiant immediately went into possession of said

lands, claiming holding and using the same as his own and he held the same continuously, openly and adversely until he conveyed to A.G. Longshore, in April 1907 and that the said A.G. Longshore, immediately went into possession of said lands and has held, claimed and used the same openly, continuously and adversely until the present time.

Affiant further states that the lands in Section 26, Township 21, South of Range 1 East, described in said deed from Bushy to affiant and from affiant to A.G. Longshore, conveys the North East quarter of the South East quarter and the South East quarter of the Northwest quarter and all that part of the Northeast quarter lying south of Beeswax Creek, and West of the Coosa River, and that this is the identical land which affiant and A.G. Longshore, have had in possession. That this is part of the same lands now owned by A.G. Longshore, and that the said A.G. Longshore, and those under whom he claims, have had the open notorious, continuous and adverse possession of the same for more than twenty (20) years. And that the said A.G. Longshore and those under whom he claims have been in the open, notorious, continuous and peaceable possession of the West half of the North West quarter of Section 26, Township 21, South of Range 1 East, lying south of Beeswax Creek for more than twenty (20) years.
