 ed G. M. Neasey who makes oath as follows:
 That he is acquainted with the following lands in Shelly County
 townit: The West half of the North East quarter of Section 23, Town-
 ship 21, South of Range 1 East.
 That he has known said lands for about 25 years; that when
 he first knew said lands they were owned by and in the actual
 open, notorious possession of A. J. Clegg and that the said A. J.
 Clegg sold the land to Eliza Neasey about the year 1892, who went
 into the immediate possession of same and held it openly no-
 toriously and exclusively, claiming it as his own until he sold
 it to Ben Neasey about the year 1902, and that Ben Neasey im-
 mediately went into the possession thereof and held and claim-
 ed the same by himself and his tenants, openly, notoriously and
 adversely until he sold the same to Bettie Neasey about the
 year 1906 and that said Bettie Neasey went into the immediate
 possession of said lands and held and claimed the same as her
 own, openly, notoriously, exclusively, and adversely, by herself and
 her tenants until about the year 1908, when she sold said land
 to J. P. McLeod, J. A. McLeod, and G. B. McLeod, and that they went into
 the immediate possession of said lands and have held and
 claimed the same as their own and had the open, notorious, and
 peaceable possession of the same from that time until the present.
 That he has never heard the title to said lands questioned or
 has known of any one claiming the same, except those men-
 tioned above during the time the respective owners claimed
 and had possession thereof.

Affiant further states that he is not certain of any of these
 dates, as they are made from his recollection, but he does

know that each of said owners respectively held said land successively until the same was sold and conveyed to each successive owner.
