 County, Luke Patillo who being duly sworn deposes and says
 as follows: My name is Luke Patillo, and I am 70 yrs. old,
 Ashury Patillo A.L. Patillo and the undersigned Luke Patillo
 were all brothers.

Ashury Patillo has been dead for more than 30 years, At the time
 of his death he left two children, T.A. Patillo and a daughter
 Mary Jane Patillo, His wife died during the Civil War, and he
 never remarried.

Mary Jane Patillo married Alphonso DuBoe, She died leaving
 no children living. She died prior to 1880. Some five or six
 years after her death I bought from Alphonso DuBoe and his
 second wife, his right, title and interest in the NW^{1/4} of NW^{1/4}
 See. 36- Tp 24 R. 15 East.

My recollection is that later I sold the interest I bought
 from Alphonso DuBoe to my brother A.L. Patillo.

Alphonso DuBoe is now dead. Ashury Patillo did not leave
 any will when he died, that I have ever heard of nor was he
 in debt at that time.

S.M. Patillo who is now living was the wife of my brother A.L.
