

State of Alabama, { Personally appeared before me L. L. Parsons a
Tuscaloosa County Justice of the Peace for the above County and State
W. W. Burkett who upon oath being sworn testified and says:
That he is the son and only living heir of his father Nathaniel
Burkett who died in Shelby County, Alabama about May in the
year 1892.

Further that at the death of his father Nathaniel Burkett
in year 1892 he left only three heirs (his wife being dead) to-wit.
John Burkett, W. W. Burkett and James R. Burkett, and at the
death of his said father there was no administration on
his estate being no debts.

Further that his father owned in his life time 240 acres of
land as follows: NE 1/4 of NE 1/4 of Sec. 26 T. 17 R. 1 East and
NW 1/4 of NW 1/4 of Sec. 25 T. 17 Range one East - Also W 1/2 of
NE 1/4 and E 1/2 of NW 1/4 of Sec 26 T. 17 R. one East all in
Shelby County, Alabama.

Further it was agreed and understood that each of the
three heirs were to have 80 acres of the above described lands
or were to share equally in the Estate.

Further that his brother John Burkett died in December 1893
and was a single man at the time of his death, and
there was no administration of his estate there being
no debts and that he and his brother James R. Burkett
were the only heirs of interest of John R. Burkett in the
lands of his father. Further that his brother James R.
Burkett sold to him W. W. Burkett and to E. R. Zohell all
his interest in his part of the said lands and at this
time his brother James R. Burkett was an unmarried man.
Further that in a joint deed dated Dec. 12th 1894 by W. W.
Burkett and his wife and James R. Burkett to E. R. Zohell
said deed recorded in Deed Book 25 page 86 in the record
of Deeds of Shelby County, Alabama, that his brother
James R. Burkett was the man who executed the
said deed and it was a mistake in writing in the
face of the deed James S. Burkett and in the signing of the
names of James Burkett, it should have been James R.
Burkett.
