Commence at the Southwest corner of Fractional Section Seven, Township twenty-four North, Range Sixteen East, and run thence north 605.3 feet along the west boundary of said Section Seven to the point of beginning of said tract of land; continue thence, turning an angle of 66 degrees and 22 minutes to the right, 930 feet in a southeasterly direction to the Coosa River, thence in a northerly direction up said river following the meanders thereof, to the mouth of Spring Creek; thence in a northwesterly direction along the center line of said Spring Creek, following the meanders thereof, to the west boundary of said Section Seven, thence south 2560 feet along said west boundary to the point of beginning of said tract of land.
