This cause coming on to be heard in Term Time having been submitted for decree on the Petition and ex-parte affidavits of S. M. Bilbrey, W. E. Davis and E. E. Flaney, thereupon, upon consideration thereof, it is ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Court, that Vera Bilbrey and Berie May Bilbrey minors who are each over the age of eighteen years, be, and they are, respectively, relieved of the disabilities of minority, and they are each vested with the power to sue and be sued, contract and be contracted with, to receive and take possession of any Real and Personal Property to which they are respectively entitled; to purchase Real or Personal Estate; to sell and convey, and to do all things, and to all intents and purposes as effectually as if they were twenty-one years of age, provided any and all acquaintances to and contracts with the administration of the estate in which said minors are interested, shall conform strictly with the decrees of the Probate Court having jurisdiction of said estates.

It is further decreed that the said S. M. Bilbrey pay the costs of this proceeding, for which Execution may issue.
