 church at Chilca Club, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, we, the said Grantors,  
 do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Convey unto the said Methodist Protestant Church at Chilca Club,

the following described Real Estate, to-wit:

A part of the S. E 1/4 of N N 1/4, section 34, Township 19, Range  
 One West and more, particularly described as follows:  
 begin at a certain rock about 20 feet from the N. E.
