

A Certified Copy of the last Will and Testament of Elijah Walker, late of Walker County Georgia, - Decedent.
State of Georgia.

In the Name of God, Amen.
I, Elijah Walker of said State and County, being of advanced age and knowing that life is uncertain deem it right and proper both as regards my family and myself that I should make a disposition of the property that a kind Providence has blessed me with do therefore make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me.

Item 1st. I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christianlike manner suitable to my Circumstances in life.

Item 2nd. I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid by my Executors hereinafter named and appointed, without delay.

Item 3rd. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Frances Walker two Negroes, Hanson a man about 37 years old Selina a girl about 12 years old, one bay mule known as the black mule, one yoke of steers and one small wagon, Two Cows and Calves, ten head of stock fow, two beds and furniture and all my lands in Georgia connected with the place I now live on, as her own property.

Item 4th. I give and bequeath to my son John B. Walker one bed and bedstead and furniture for said bed.
 Item 5th. I give and bequeath to my son James P. Walker one bed and bedstead and furniture for said bed.
 Item 6th. I desire and direct that all the balance of my estate be sold by my Executors hereinafter named and appointed and the proceeds arising from said sale to be equally divided between all my children.
 Item 7th. I desire and bequeath that the children of my son William E. Walker have one equal interest with the balance of my children - sister C. Walker, wife of my son William E. to have no interest in my Estate.
 Item 8th. I hereby constitute and appoint my two sons John B. Walker and James P. Walker Executors of this my last will and testament December the 12th 1862.
