 Witnesseth, that the said parties of the first part
 and in consideration of the sum of three hundred and
 fifty Dollars to them in hand paid by the said parties
 of the second part, the receipt of which is hereby
 acknowledged have bargained sold conveyed and
 the Estate of James P. Walker deceased have granted
 bargained sold and conveyed and does hereby grant
 bargain, sell and convey unto the said parties of the
 second part the following described premises, to wit,
 situate in District No. 18, bounded as follows:

Beginning S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. $\frac{1}{2}$ of the S. $\frac{1}{2}$ of the fourth of Section 12, and
 N. $\frac{1}{2}$ of S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ and N. $\frac{1}{2}$ of S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the East half of the
 North West fourth in the East half - South West fourth in
 the East half and the South West fourth of the South West fourth
 Section 13 all in Township 18 of Range One in Liberty Co.
 Ala, containing 360 acres more or less, with its heredita-
 ments and appurtenances thereto appertaining hereby releasing
 all claims to Homestead and Dower therein. To have and to
 hold the said premises to the said parties of the second
 part, their heirs and assigns forever.

And the said parties of the first part for them and for their
 heirs, Executors and Administrators does hereby cove-
 nant with the said parties of the second part their heirs
 and assigns, that we are lawfully seized in fee simple
 of the premises above conveyed, and have full power
 authority and right to convey the same, that said prem-
 ises are free from all incumbrances and that we will
 forever warrant and defend the said premises and title
 thereto against the lawful claims of all persons whomsoever.
