 Shelby County } Whereas an execution issued
 from the City Court of Birmingham, Jefferson County
 against Mary M. McMahon and Sam Hill John in
 favor of H. J. Lloyd on a judgment rendered in said
 Court on the 22nd day of October, 1913, for the sum of
 One Hundred eighty seven & 31/100 (\$187.31) - Dollars,
 besides Costs of Suit, which said execution came into
 my hands as Sheriff of said County on the 14th day
 of April, 1914, to execute and return according to law
 by virtue of which said execution, I did
 levy a forced levy upon the following as the prop-
 erty of the said Sam Hill John to-wit:
 Beginning at a point 750 Chains South of North East
 Corner of Section Twelve (12) Township Twenty-two (22),
 Range Two (2) West and run West forty (40) Chains, thence South

 Range One West, all in Shelby County, Alabama, of
 which said levy then and there notice was given the
 Defendant personally, and after giving notice of the
 time, place and terms of sale by advertisement once
 a week for three successive weeks in the Probate
 Abstract or Newspaper published in Columbiana,
 Alabama Shelby County, in said County, and also
 by giving thirty days previous notice of the time,

 Alban, as Sheriff of said Shelby County do hereby
 sell convey transfer and return to the said
 S. S. Hobbs all the title, interest and claim which
 the said Sam Hill John had held and owned in
 and to the foregoing described premises as fully
 and completely, in all respects, as I might, could
 or ought to convey the same under and by virtue
 of the power and authority vested in me in the
 premises and by the Statutes for such cases provided.

 heirs and assigns forever.
