 I hereby make has been paid and for the further
 consideration of her Care of me while I may live
 I do hereby give, convey, sell and bequeath to my
 said sister Ann Dandy the following described
 property, to-wit: One Tract now in my possession;
 all my household and kitchen furniture; my
 entire crop of Corn Cotton etc., for 1914; and all
 personal, real or mixed property that I may be
 possessed of or to which I might be entitled to
 at my death; To have, and to hold all of
 said property as hers, the possession of which I
 hereby deliver to my said sister for her to use
 and dispose of as her own property.
