B. Moore second part. Witnesseth that the party of the first part
for consideration of one hundred and fifty Dollars to them in
hand paid by the party of the second part, the receipt whereof
is hereby acknowledged, having sold and hereby sell, confirm
and convey unto the party of the second part, all the following
described land being and lying in Shelby County and State
of Alabama, to-wit: South half of the South East quarter of Sec-
tion Twenty, one, Township nineteen, Range one East.
To have and to hold to the party of second part, their heirs
and assigns forever, the above described hereby granted lands and
premises. And the party of first part hereby covenant with
the said party of the second part, that we are lawful seizers
of and have good right to sell and convey said lands and
hereby bind ourselves, our heirs and legal representatives to

warrant and defend the title of said land and premises to the party of the second part, their heirs, assigns and legal representatives against the claims of all and every person in law or equity, and against the government of the United States.
