

Warranty Deed,

This indenture, made and entered into this the first day of January A.D. 1912, by and between J.H. Wilder and wife G.A. Wilder of the first part, and S.E. Elliott of the County of Shelby and State of Alabama, of the second part,

Witnesseth, that the said J.H. Wilder and G.A. Wilder for and in consideration of the sum of twelve hundred & fifty (\$1250.00) Dollars, to them in hand paid by the party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have this day granted, bargained sold, aliened and conveyed, enfeoffed and by these presents does grant, bargain sell, enfeoff and convey to the said S.E. Elliott, all that certain tract or parcel of land

lying and being in the County of Shelby and State of Alabama,  
and more particularly described as follows to wit, One certain  
lot or parcel of land in the village of Hackerville in said  
County, upon which is situated the only brick store house in  
said village and bounded as follows, On the north by lot of  
E. V. Caldwell, on the east by lot of R. M. Borum, on the south  
by lot of the Baptist Church and on the west by the Coosa  
Valley Public Road and being the lot formerly owned by an  
Englishman as Thomas J. Martin lot, the same together with all  
the rights, tenements hereditaments and appurtenances there-  
unto belonging or in any wise appertaining.

To have and to hold, the above described tract or parcel of land,  
together with the tenements and appurtenances thereto belonging  
or otherwise appertaining unto the said party of the second part  
his heirs and assigns forever. And the said J. H. Wilder and E. A.  
Wilder of the first part for themselves, their heirs, executors and  
administrators does warrant and will forever defend the title  
to the above described and hereby granted premises unto the  
said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, from and  
against themselves and all and every person claiming or  
holding under them, the said party of the first part, and against  
the lawful title, claim or demand of all and every person  
whomsoever claiming or holding by force or under the Govern-  
ment of the United States.
