White became the purchaser of said property so levied on as aforesaid for the sum of Seventy-one & $\frac{27}{100}$ (\$71.27) Dollars, being the highest, best and last bidder for the same.

Now therefore know all men by these presents That in pursuance of the premises, for and in consideration of the said sum of Seventy-one & $\frac{27}{100}$ (\$71.27) Dollars, to me in hand paid by the said J.R. White the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, I, J.R. Allan as Sheriff of said County, do hereby sell, convey, transfer and set over to the said J.R. White, all the title, interest and claim the said Pinkie Stone tract, held and owned in and to the foregoing described premises as fully and completely in all respects as I might, could or ought to convey the same under and by virtue of the power and authority vested in me in the premises and by the Statutes for such cases provided. To have and to hold unto the said J.R. White heirs and assigns forever.
