

The First Trust and Savings Bank and Emile H. Boist, Trustees
 named in a certain indenture of mortgage made and executed
 by the Republic Iron and Steel Company, dated October, 1st

 to secure an authorized issue of bonds known as the First

 Republic Iron and Steel Company to an aggregate amount

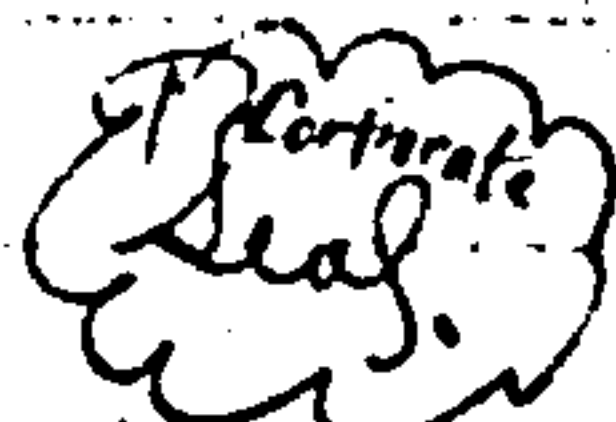
limited to Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000) face value. We hereby certify that said mortgage and supplemental mortgage together with all bonds issued and outstanding thereunder have been fully satisfied in the manner following to wit: All of said bonds (except Eighty Six Thousand Dollars (\$86,000) face value thereof have been duly paid and cancelled; all of said bonds have been duly called for payment on the 1st day of October 1914, in the manner provided by Section 2, of Article Third of said mortgage and sufficient funds have been deposited with the Corporate Trustee, First Trust and Savings Bank, to pay all of said Eighty Six Thousand Dollars (\$86,000) of bonds together with a premium of 5% thereon and interest thereon up to October 1st 1914 and said funds are now held by said Bank for that purpose; and we do hereby consent that the said mortgage and supplemental mortgage may be cancelled of record.

And as such Trustees, in consideration of the premises and Ten Dollars paid, we release, remise and quit-claim unto said Republic Iron and Steel Company only, and all interest in the property conveyed to us as aforesaid by said mortgage and supplemental mortgage and in any property which has become subject to the lien of said mortgages by subsequent purchase or otherwise.

Our witness whereof said First Trust and Savings Bank has caused this Release Deed to be executed in its name, by its Vice-President under its corporate seal duly attested by its Secretary; and said Emile K. Boicot has hereunto set his hand and seal this 14th day of January 1915.
